

CRIMINAL JUSTICE (CJ)

CJ 200. Introduction to Criminal Justice - SB 3 Units

Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer

Description: Overview of crime and the response of the United States justice system, focusing on law enforcement, courts, and corrections. Explores the impact of crime on communities and examines how the justice system responds to these issues in contemporary society. CJ 201. Introduction to Law Enforcement - SB 3 Units

Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer

Description: Introduction to the development of law enforcement in the United States, including its history, models, organizations, and current challenges.

CJ 202. Introduction to Corrections - SB 3 Units

Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer

CJ 203. Introduction to Law and the Legal System 3 Units

Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring

Prerequisite(s): No pre-requisites This course will provide you with an overview of the major principles and functions of our legal system.

Description: This course will introduce you to the various legal fields and specialties. Legal aspects of current topics will be discussed to assist you in acquiring knowledge and appreciation of the law in our changing society. Legal Vocabulary will be emphasized. This course will introduce you to the various fields of the legal profession (to include attorneys, judges, paralegals, law enforcement and professions that have significant contact with the judicial system).

Grading Basis: Pass/Fail

Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer

CJ 300. Career Development and Cultural Intelligence - SB 3 Units

Term Typically Offered: Occasionally Offered

Prerequisite(s): CJ 200.

Description: Examines career development in criminal justice by fostering awareness of cultural diversity, also known as cultural intelligence.

CJ 301. Introduction to Digital Forensics and Media Analysis 3 Units

Term Typically Offered: Occasionally Offered

Prerequisite(s): CJ 160, CJ 161, and CJ 162; or consent of instructor.

Description: Introduction to the collection, preservation, and presentation of computer-based evidence for criminal law enforcement and civil litigation. Covers the role of computer forensic practitioners in investigating digital crime scenes and related legal issues.

CJ 304. Criminal Justice Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) 1-2 Units

Grading Basis: Pass/Fail

Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer

Prerequisite(s): 12 credit hours at the University of Louisville and documentation of training record.

Description: Equip students with skills to document and assess prior learning from occupational training. Students create a Prior Learning Assessment Document (PLAD) that combines reflection and documentation for evaluation and college credit. Writing, thinking, and technology skills are emphasized.

Theories of Crime and Behavior Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer Description: Explores theories and research on criminality from biological, psychological, and sociological perspectives. Harm Reduction and Public Safety Term Typically Offered: Occasionally Offered Description: Explores criminological and environmental theories and methods for crime prevention and reduction. CJ 326. Quantitative Analysis in Criminal Justice - QR Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer Prerequisite(s): The Kentucky Council on Post-Secondary Education (PCE) sets an ACT score of 19 or above as an academic readiness indicator for the area of Mathematics (Quantitative Reasoning). Description: Other course readiness markers for this class are SAT (510) or completion of GEN 103. Introduction to statistics and analysis of criminal justice data, emphasizing measurement, descriptive, and inferential statistical methods in criminal justice research. CJ 335. Court Administration Term Typically Offered: Occasionally Offered Description: Studies court organization, administration, and management through the lens of a court administrator. Juvenile Justice Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer Prerequisite(s): CJ 200 or consent of instructor. Examines history, key issues, and the roles of law enforcement, courts, corrections, and community in its contemporary model. CJ 370. Law Enforcement Administration 3 Units Term Typically Offered: Occasionally Offered Prerequisite(s): CJ 201 or consent of instructor. Description: Examines police organization and administration, covering the history of law enforcement structures, the political environment of agencies, the role of law enforcement in different societies, and key management functions. CJ 375. Social and Restorative Justice 3 Units Term Typically Offered: Occasionally Offered Description: Links social justice and criminology while considering the causes of harm. Explores assumptions about crime and justice through retributive and restorative justice paradigms while addressing key social justice issues. Note: Cross-listed with SCHG 375. Crimes Against Older Adults 3 Units Description: Examines federal and state laws designed to protect older adults, focusing on legal protections and the criminal justice system's response to the mistreatment and exploitation of this population. Covers key aspects of the criminal justice process, including disposition, bail, extradition, hearings, trial, and post-sentencing procedures like probation and parole. Description: Examines the assessment of fatal violence, covering topics such as organized and disorganized behavioral patterns, stages of homicide, blood spatter analysis, investigative processes, media influence, and typologies of individuals involved in violent crimes. Note: Students must complete an application, receive approval, and secure an internship prior to enrolling in the course. Emphasizes the criminal justice system's role in responding to and addressing these issues. CJ 485. Criminal Justice Senior Seminar - WR, CUE Term Typically Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer Prerequisite(s): CJ 200, CJ 325, and CJ 326; Senior standing or consent of instructor. Description: Senior level seminar that explores and discusses the challenges and issues in the administration and management of criminal justice organizations. Note: Approved for the Arts and Sciences upper-level requirement in written communication (WR). Course Attribute(s): CUE - This course fulfills the Culminating Undergraduate Experience (CUE) requirement for certain degree programs.
